### Teaching Pyramid for Families: Setting the Stage for a Great Year!

The beginning of the year is the best time to establish the framework for a successful school experience. The following are key strategies that teachers will be implementing along with companion parent strategies that you can be doing to help reinforce and support your child.

Teaching Pyramid Strategy	Parent Component
<b>Building Positive/Meaningful Relationships:</b> Teachers will be finding opportunities to build and establish relationships with children, and build friendships at school.	Ask your child who they played with today, and help them remember how their teacher cared for them during the day.
<b>Teaching the Daily Routine:</b> The routine supports children's ability to feel safe and comfortable in their school environment when it is reliable and predictable.	Help your child through separation anxiety by letting them know when you will return. "I'll be back after nap-time."
<b>Teaching the School Rules:</b> Teachers will notice when children <u>are</u> following the rules, and commenting on it positively. WE are SAFE, KIND, and RESPECTFUL.	Start using Positive Descriptive Acknowledgement at home in relation to the school rules.
<b>Tell me what to do instead:</b> Teachers are using a strategy that provides expectation to children removing the cause and effect of negative behavior.	Share your expectations with children by telling them what you want them to do, and save the "no" and "don't" for emergency situations when it really counts. <i>See the companion documents this month.</i>
