# **Intermediate Programming**

**Description:** This course is designed only for students who have had a solid exposure to the C programming language and would like to continue to learn more and develop proficiency using C and C++. We will be enhancing our knowledge of Arrays, Pointers, Strings, and learn how to use Structs. In addition, we will learn how to input from files and write to files using both C and C++ depending on the proficiency and experience of the student. We will touch on Object Oriented Programming with C++. The class activities will include some direct instruction, and mostly laboratory work that allows the students to develop solutions to interesting and challenging problems. During labs, students will learn to design, test and debug solutions, using proper programming techniques.

**Awareness & Advocacy: Human Trafficking**

**Description:** What is human trafficking: it is an exploitation of vulnerable people, most commonly through sexual exploitation and forced labor. The victim feels enslaved within their situation and is usually hidden from public sight. In this J-term class we will talk about different aspects of human trafficking: what does it look like, why does it happen, how can we prevent it? And, we will get creative: how can we educate and advocate for change - using our unique creative gifts - perhaps fine art, infographics, fashion design, dance or spoken word... whatever it is you have a gift and passion for. \*\* Please be aware that we will be covering some sensitive subjects. While we will not delve too far into details, some of the information will be upsetting.\*\*

**Bead Loom Weaving: Warping and Wefting**
